We will use the 10 meter frequency of 28.421 MHz, the 6 meter frequency of 50.135 MHz, and the 2 meter simplex frequency 146.520 MHz. All frequencies are open to technicians and above. After roll call on 2 meters, we will return to the K4OGB repeater for a wrap-up. All licensed amateur radio operators are invited to participate in this evenings' net.

This is a formal net, so please direct all comments or requests to Net Control. We will now take check-ins. Check-ins will be in alphabetical order, using the first letter of your call sign suffix. When checking in, please call Net Control, un-key to listen for a possible double, then give your call sign phonetically, your name and your location. Also notify net control if you will only participate in one band of the net.

***NOTE: After each group of check-ins, please acknowledge by call signs so they are sure they were heard.***

Stations Alpha through Golf, please call Net Control

Stations Hotel through Mike, please call Net Control

Stations November through Zulu, please call Net Control.

Any stations, Alpha through Zulu, please call Net Control.

**Note: after acknowledging each station, announce move to 28.421 MHz**
